Pilot Project Funding 2009/10

The Interdisciplinary Development Extramural Associate (IDEA) award from the Eunice Kennedy Shriver National Institute of Child Health and Human Development provides funding to support pilot projects submitted by research teams of interdisciplinary faculty and students. Beginning 2009-10 through 2012-13 there is \$40,000 in funding available per year for pilot research projects.

Those interested in submitting a pilot project proposal are encouraged to attend the 2009-2010 series of [EARDA Grant Workshops](#) which will focus on developing a research proposal for submission to GRAB by December 2009. Researchers who plan to submit the pilot project proposal should begin preparing proposals and completing necessary certification, such as [human subjects training](#) and [IRB approval](#). Approved proposals will be submitted to the NIH in March 2010 and if selected, may receive funding as early as July 2010. Dates may vary slightly when 2010 key dates are released.

Welcome to the Year 2 Activities of the Fresno State EARDA NIH Research Development Program!

The mission of the Extramural Associates Research Development Award (EARDA) program is to encourage research by faculty and students through training and technical assistance. Through support provided by the Eunice Kennedy Shriver National Institute of Child Health and Human Development, California State University, Fresno has been able to establish the Interdisciplinary Health Proposal Development Office (IHPDO) which functions in conjunction with the Office of Research and Sponsored Programs.

The IHPDO presents bi-monthly seminars and workshops to increase opportunities for interdisciplinary biomedical and behavioral research among faculty and students from the Colleges of Health and Human Services, Science and Mathematics, and Social Science. At the October 20th meeting, Dr. A.M. Aminian, a local allergist, discussed asthma, issues related to asthma which are specific to the San Joaquin Valley, and possible areas of research in the community. At our next meeting on November 2nd, a respiratory therapist who works in a Community Health Center and a potential community partner will be available to answer questions and provide general background.
