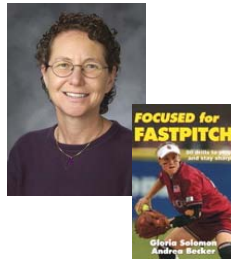

Students and professionals who present at this Symposium may submit their abstract for consideration for other state, national and international conferences.

Dr. Gloria Solomon is Associate Professor of Kinesiology and Health Science at California State University, Sacramento where she teaches and conducts research in sport and exercise psychology. Dr. Solomon is co-owner of MentaPhysical Performance Consulting, an AASP certified sport psychology consultant and co-author of *Focused for Fastpitch* where she provides the tools to sharpen concentration at the plate, stay more alert on the field and the base paths, and shut out distractions in the circle. Dr. Solomon is AASP's current Publications and Information Division Head and past-chair of the Performance Enhancement/Intervention Committee, and vice president of the Sacramento Community Tennis Association. In addition, she is a board member of the *Journal*

of *Applied Sport Psychology* and *The Sport Psychologist*. A reception and book signing will follow Dr. Solomon's address Friday evening.

The second day program will consist of a workshop by Dr. Solomon, guest speakers, research presentations, student research proposals, and intervention presentations. We encourage all students and professionals to submit abstract proposals and attend the 2009 California Sport and Exercise Psychology Symposium, as this is the perfect venue for all presentations and will be a valuable experience for students interested in the profession.
