**Robert C. Marshall, Ph.D.  
Professor, Communication Disorders  
University of Kentucky**

Robert Marshall, Ph.D. is currently a professor in the Department of Rehabilitation Sciences, Division of Communication Disorders at the University of Kentucky. Dr. Marshall has been a speech-language pathologist for over 40 years. His most recent work focuses on strategies for communicating with stroke patients in a physical therapy gym or hospital room who experience aphasia. Dr. Marshall holds a M.S. degree in Speech-Language Pathology from the University of Oregon and a Ph.D. in Philosophy from the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center. He was the Chief of the Audiology and Speech Pathology Program at the Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Portland, Oregon and has been the North American Editor for the journal *Aphasiology* since 1987.
