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Background

June English (1920-1987) worked as a historian and researcher for the Pineridge District of the Sierra National Forest between 1978 and 1987, although she had been a reputable researcher for many years prior to her employment with the Forest Service. She was also active in the Fresno City and County Historical Society and was a member of the Fresno Genealogical Society. One of her most significant accomplishments was the compilation of the June English Forestry Collection, which includes a detailed index of clippings, grazing permits, mining and homesteading claims, oral histories, and other historical sources relating to the history of the Sierra Nevada foothills and the Sierra National Forest.

Scope and Content Note

The June English Forestry collection measures 13.75 linear feet and dates from 1853 to 1988. The collection is arranged in fifteen series: Subject files, Grazing permits, Surnames, Forest service personnel, *Sierra Ranger*, Place names, Sawmills, Logging, Native Americans, Hydro-projects, Mines–Mining–Miners, Packers, Oral histories, Special use cards and Photographs. June English compiled an extensive card index (housed in card catalog drawers), arranged by subject, which serves as a guide to the collection. This includes listings for the numerous files in boxes, as well as maps that are in map case B, drawer 19. The “Box” designations in the box list coincide with the “File” designations on the index cards. The collection has been left in its original arrangement, as structured by its creator, June English.

The **Subject files** series (1857, 1864-1987 and undated) contains articles, newspaper clippings, pamphlets, research notes and other literature pertaining to the history of the Sierra Nevada foothills and the Sierra National Forest. There are also numerous maps included in this series, some of which have been transferred to map case B, drawer 19. The Subject files series contains a broad range of topics including fauna, flora, livestock, forest fires and transportation.

The **Grazing permits** series (1905-1955) contains documents regarding grazing permits filed for regions of the Sierra Nevada foothills and the Sierra National Forest. These files contain correspondence between the ranchers and the Forest Supervisor, payment records, copies of deeds, applications for grazing permits and copies of the permits themselves. The material in this series is actually only a small sample, about one-fifth, of the permits that are stored at the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA)–Pacific Region facility in San Bruno, California. June English selected the permits within this series to function as an example of what is available in San Bruno.

The **Surnames** series (1853-1987) contains historical documents pertaining to the early residents of Fresno County and the surrounding area. The newspaper clippings (including many obituaries), correspondence, legal documents, and grazing permits discuss the early settlers as well as their families. There are also photocopies of excerpts from historical books, including

History of Fresno County by Paul Vandor (1919) and *History of Fresno County*, published by Wallace W. Elliott & Co. in 1882.

The **Forest service personnel** series (1903-1908, 1917-1987 and undated) contains documents regarding the United States Forest Service and the Sierra National Forest. This includes newspaper clippings, correspondence, Forest Service publications, and personal narratives, including that written by Roy Boothe and an interview of Robert Thomas conducted by June English.

The **Sierra Ranger** series (1911-1918, 1980-1988) contains many issues of the *Sierra Ranger*, a bulletin published by the Sierra National Forest in North Fork, California. There is nearly a complete set from volume 1, number 1 (1911) to volume 6, number 4 (1918). There is also a selection of modern issues dating from 1980 to 1985.

The **Place names** series (1870-1871, 1878-1891, 1897-1899, 1906-1945, 1951-1987 and undated) contains information, both historical and contemporary, about the towns and geographical features in the Fresno County and Sierra Nevada regions. This includes newspaper clippings, correspondence, transcripts of interviews conducted by June English, historical essays (including some written by Ernestine Winchell and Nathan Sweet) and photocopies of excerpts from books as well as some books in their entirety.

The **Sawmills** series (1940-1941, 1984) is entirely comprised of a manuscript titled *Sawmill History of the Sierra National Forest, 1852-1940*. This publication was produced in 1941 by Bert Hurt upon the request of Forest Supervisor M.A. Benedict. Hurt's specific objective was to "compile a history of the sawmills that had operated [in] the Sierra Forest prior to and since ... its creation as a Forest Reserve in 1893" (Box H, Sawmills; *Sawmill History of the Sierra National Forest 1852-1940*, Preface). This manuscript was compiled using references at the Fresno County Library and the Fresno State College Library, as well as records from Mariposa County, specifically early issues of the *Mariposa Gazette*. Hurt also interviewed many old timers in order to uncover further information on sawmill operations in the Sierra National Forest. At the end of the document are photocopies of numerous pictures of the area's sawmills, some including illustrations of the workers and equipment used.

The **Logging** series (1870-1871, 1882, 1904-1908, 1917-1919, 1928-1949, 1954-1987) primarily consists of newspaper clippings, correspondence from the Forest Supervisor, and documents regarding land use by logging operations in the Sierra Nevada. Also included in this series are other historical documents describing logging operations in the Fresno County area. Along with pamphlets and essays, there is an archaeological reconnaissance report written by Jo Anne Kipps titled "Consolidation and Its Aftermath: Pine Logging Camp" (1983).

Scope and Content Note (cont.)

The **Native Americans** series (1870-1871, 1882, 1908-1933, 1943-1987) covers a variety of topics relating to the lives of Native Americans (in June English's card index, they are referred to as Indians) in the Fresno County area. This includes historical, cultural and general information about various Indian tribes, including the Miwok, Yokut and Monache. The materials within this series take the form of newspaper clippings, pamphlets, newsletters, legal documents and reports. There are also numerous complete copies of and excerpts from various publications. This includes the *California Roll Book* produced by the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs, which was condensed by June English in November 1986 to include only those Yokuts, Monache, Miwok and some Native Americans of unknown origin who lived on the western slopes of the Sierra Nevada. Also found in the series are copies of *Miwok Means People* by Eugene L. Conrotto (1973), *Gold Seeker: Adventures of a Belgian Argonaut During the Gold Rush Years* by Jean-Nicholas Perlot (1985), and *Yokuts and Western Mono Ethnography* by Anna H. Gayton (1948).

The **Hydro-projects** series (1905-1910, 1919-1934, 1941-1987) contains newspaper clippings, correspondence, pamphlets and documents regarding land use by electric companies. There are also some notable research reports, including "History of Big Creek Project" by Al and Louise Schiebelhut (1977) and "Balsam Meadow Cultural Resource Study: Ethnology and History" by the Theodoratus Cultural Research Group (1978). This series also contains copies of books, both in their entirety and by section. There are complete copies of *Sierra Outpost* by Lila Lofberg and David Malcolmson (1941) and *The Story of Big Creek* by David H. Redinger (1955).

The **Mines–Mining–Miners** series (1870-1874, 1882-1891, 1902-1948, 1954-1987) is largely composed of newspaper clippings, correspondence, records of both land use and mining claims, and reports, including many that were published by the State Mineralogist. This material focuses on the mines, mining and miners, as well as the mineral resources themselves, in the Fresno County area.

The **Packers** series (1927-1986) contains information regarding the packing stations in the Fresno County and Sierra Nevada area. It is primarily composed of newspaper clippings but also includes legal documents, specifically payment and land use records and documents related to individual packers' grazing privileges.

The **Oral histories** series (1963-1987 and undated) contains transcripts of interviews conducted by June English, many on behalf of the Sierra National Forest. There are also numerous excerpts from diaries of early residents.

The **Special use cards** series (1910-1968) contains records of land use in certain areas within the Sierra Nevada. The cards describe who was in control of the land at a specified time

and how the land was being used. The series is organized by location, including Kingsview, Mariposa, Bass Lake, Minarets and Pineridge Districts. There is also a section devoted to residential tracts, including Bear Creek, Bear Creek Extension, Deer Creek, Dowville, Home Creek, Huckleberry, Idyllwilde, Lakeview, Lowerline Creek, Rancheria, Snowslide, Musick Creek, and Upper Line Creek. Each section is organized alphabetically by resident.

The **Photographs** series (1925-1941, 1951-1958, 1975-1978 and undated) contains prints depicting early residents of the Sierra Nevada. This includes photographs of early settlers, Native Americans and numerous residences and businesses. Many of the photographs (E/F 1-40) are copies made in 1981 with color film. The original photographs were in a scrapbook belonging to William M. Turner. Photographs E/F 84-133 are the original prints from Bradley Wagman Doyle's scrapbook. These photographs portray the Southern California Edison Company on Kern River.

Related Collections

June English Collection

This collection contains tape recordings of oral history interviews conducted by June English. Many of these interviews were conducted for use by researchers in the Sierra National Forest history files. This includes interviews of Floyd Lobree, Bob Kirkpatrick, Lewis Duncan, Susan O'Dell, Arnold Snyder, Robert Thompson and Gene Tully. See Box 14, Oral histories, 1967-1987 and undated.
